

RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Smoking is forbidden in the whole building of YMSA, including the dorm. The only designated place for smoking is on the balcony of the building. The balcony closes at 1 am.
2. Classrooms are available for teaching and practicing from 6 am to 10 pm.
3. The keys of the classrooms can be collected at the reception. Taking of the key must be confirmed by your legible name and signature in the register.
4. After practicing, please close the windows, turn off the lights, lock the door and take the key back to the reception. Leaving of the key at the reception must be confirmed by your signature in the register.
5. During your stay in the building of YMSA, the principle of personal responsibility is in force, each participant is responsible for the safety of his/her personal belongings.
6. Moving or removing furniture and equipment, especially instruments like organ, piano or harpsichord is not allowed.
Returning music stands to their original place after use is required.
7. In case of any malfunction, please inform the technical staff immediately or write it in the booklet at the reception.
8. Each participant is responsible for his/her actions throughout the duration of the Young Musicians' Summer Academy.
9. Any damage to property must be reported immediately to the staff. In case of the participant is responsible for the damage, the participant must compensate for it.
10. In case of contravention the offender may be required to leave the Young Musicians' Summer Academy.
11. The participant is obliged to inform the organisers of any changes concerning the mastercourses, rehearsals, concerts, contact information and shortcomings.
12. Participants acknowledge that the event involves public performances, that the organisers of the YMSA may take photos and video recordings related the event with the intention of public communication, and that the officially produced photos and videos will be used by the organisers in accordance with the event's Privacy Policy.
13. Participants undertake to comply with current epidemiological restrictions and rules.
14. The participants note that in case of vis maior situation (war, civil war, terrorist attack, strike, fire, epidemic, flood, earthquake, national mourning, government decree, decision of local authorities, or other causes beyond human control, e.g. impassable road conditions), the organisers may decide to postpone the Young Musicians' Summer Academy.
